In total this event raised more than \$370,000 dollars, this is Jericho's largest gala fundraising total to date. Progress at 1842 Anthony Avenue



Our new project at 1842 Anthony Ave. is well under way! Our partners have been hard at work for the past several months preparing our space for future

residents and clients. This new building will provide housing to 22 LGBTQ+ young adults in the Bronx - a community that is disproportionately affected by homelessness and housing insecurity. Set between two existing Jericho properties on Anthony Ave., this building will connect all three buildings via a single point of access. This new site will also provide community space and a garden for all three buildings. Collectively, 84 formerly homeless individuals will receive housing and services through our Anthony Ave. Residences. We expect this project to be completed in early 2024.

Horticultural Therapy Program Updates



We are excited to introduce Jericho's newest program, the Horticultural Therapy Program: Securing and Establishing Root Growth (SERG). Horticultural Therapy is a research-based approach to therapy that uses gardening to help people better their mental health. Through learning and mindfulness, our residents can reduce their stress and boost their overall mood. This program consists of bi-weekly courses for our residents. Since the program's inception, residents have grown basil and begun using their own Lettuce Grow farm stand to cultivate produce. We can't wait to share future updates and harvests from the Horticultural Therapy Program with you all!

Recent Grants Awarded to Jericho Project

Bank of America Charitable Foundation gave in support of our Workforce Opportunities Program (WfO). This grant will be used to strengthen the program, which utilizes an individualized approach in helping Jericho clients and residents achieve their professional goals. WfO programing is comprised of workshops, training, referrals to educational courses, job search assistance and much more.

BlackRock Charitable Foundation also awarded Jericho Project a grant in support of our Workforce Opportunities Program (WfO). WfO provides

services to more than 60% of Jericho Project's residents. On average clients who participate in the Workforce Opportunities program have an hourly wage of \$17.25 for full-time employees.

Eugene and Theresa Lang Foundation awarded Jericho Project a grant this June. These funds will also be used for general support of Jericho Project's programs and initiatives. To read more about our programs and services, click here.
