Jericho Welcomes its first Director of Training



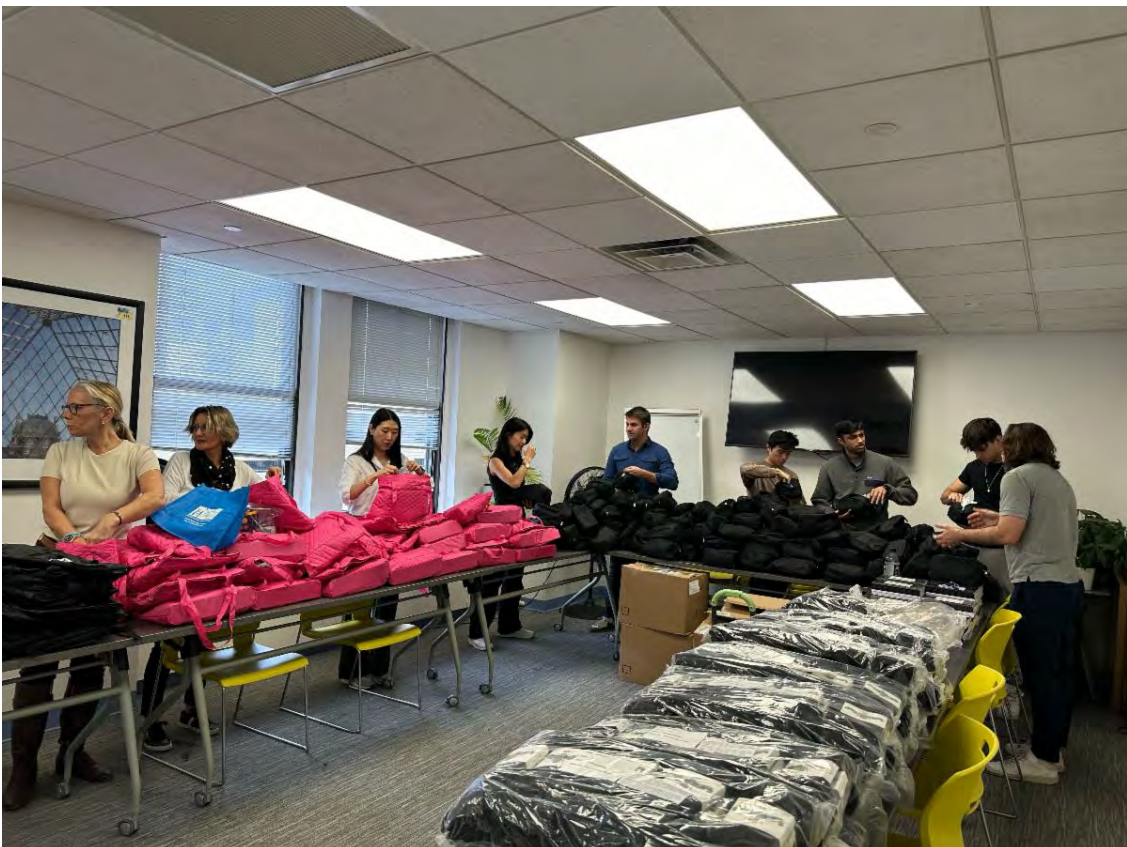
Tanysha Casellas, Jericho Project's new (and first) Director of Training, officially became a part of the Jericho family on November 14, 2023.
